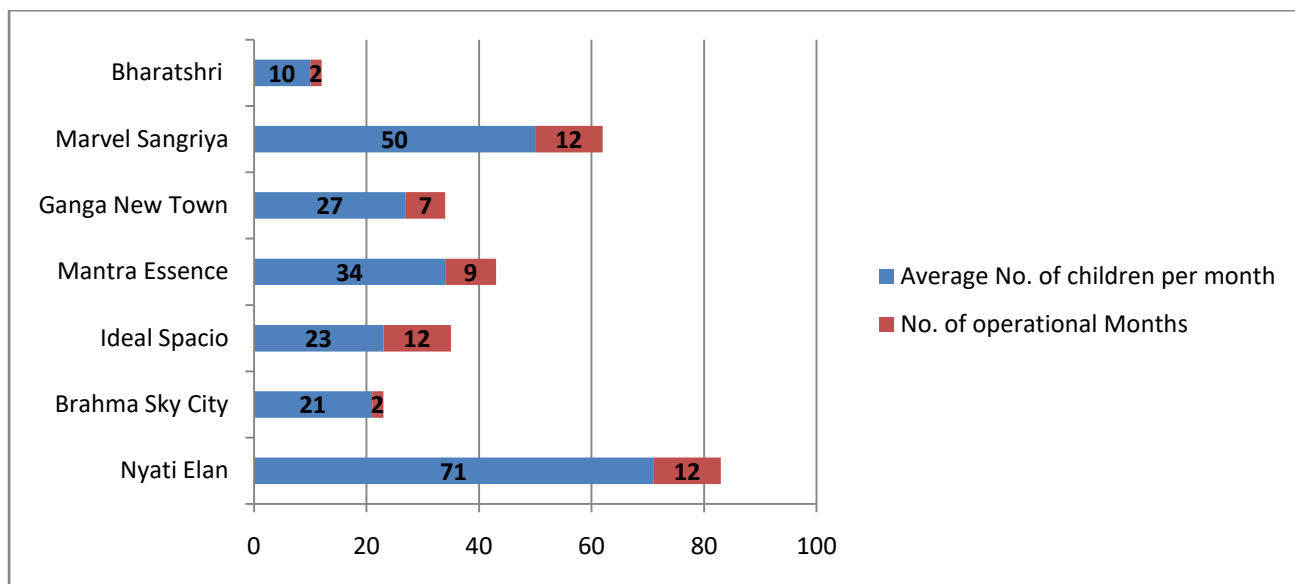

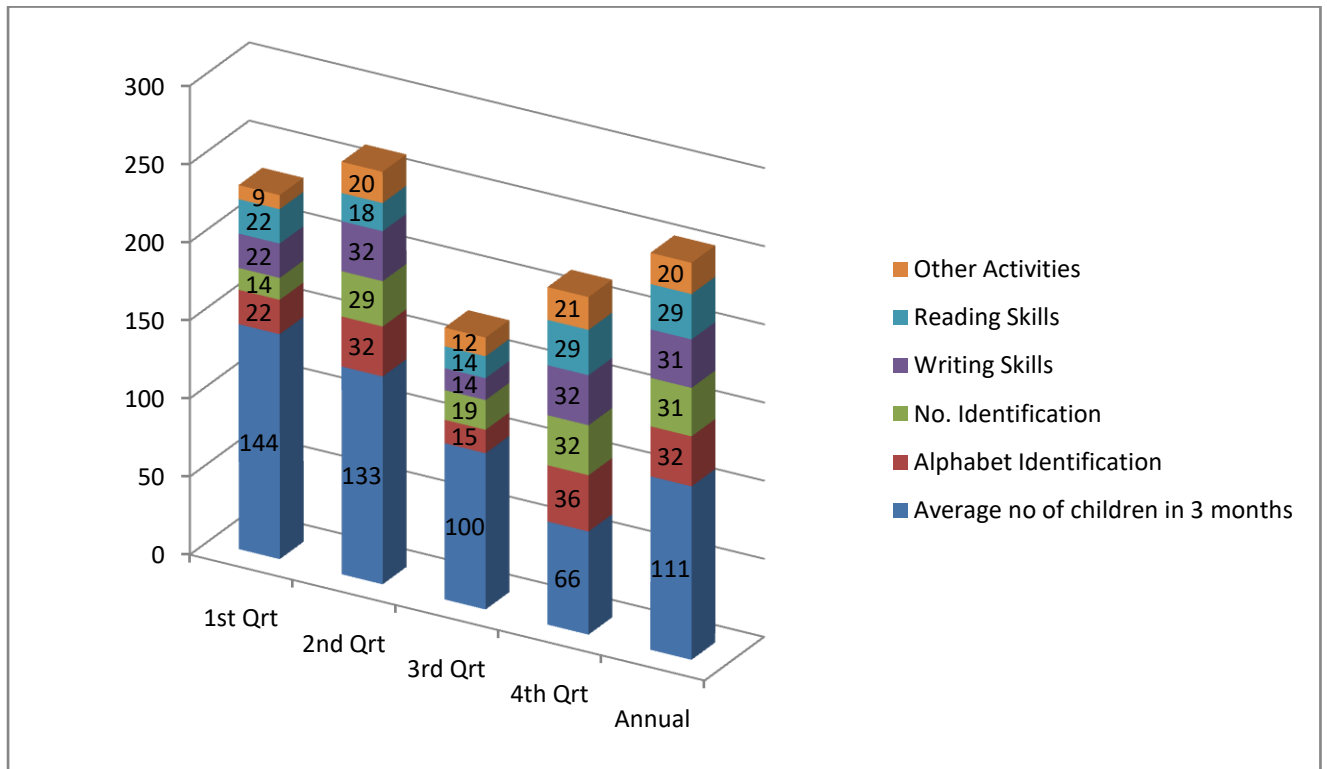

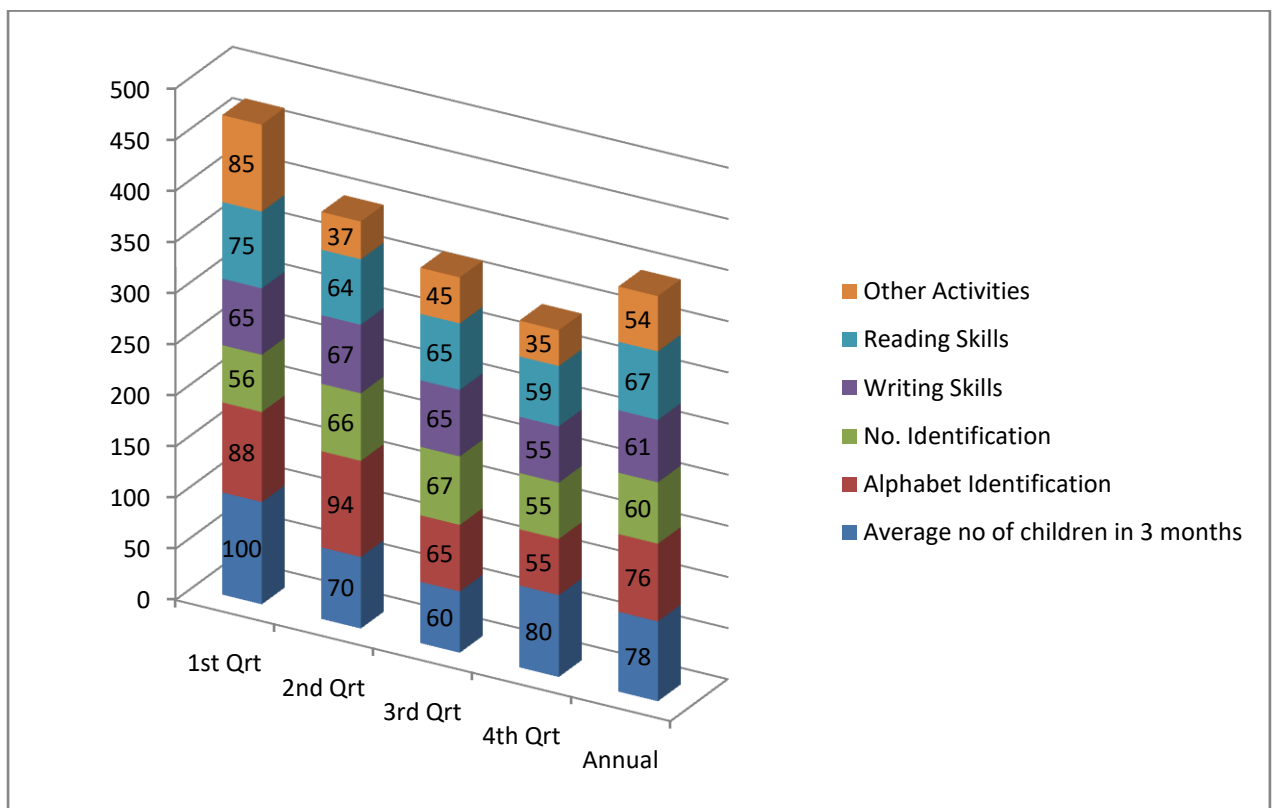

Health

Awareness Session:

- Awareness session on basic **Health & Hygiene** was conducted for parents and children. The following topics were discussed and informed
 - ✚ Precaution to be taken during monsoon and summer season
 - ✚ Type of clothes to be worn while going out
 - ✚ Type of food to be consumed and precautions taken while cooking
 - ✚ Use of safe water and keeping the surroundings clean
 - ✚ Taking special care of children between 0-3 years

Health Check-up:

- Eye check-up for children and adults were conducted at **Nyati Elan**, Wagholi, Ideal, Mantra, Sangria and Bharatshri Co.hou.soc by ophthalmologist from Desai Hospital. Spectacles were also distributed as per the prescription at a very nominal price.

- De-worming was done of all the children in coordination with Primary Government Health Centres. De-worming is done half-yearly and it should not be repeated within 6 months



➤ Polio Vaccination camp was also arranged with the help of PMC.

Regular Health Awareness Session:

- Dental health Check-up Camp was arranged for children.
- On regular basis the parent are informed about health and hygiene by the centre teacher during PTMs.
- They are told to take care of their child's health, maintain hygiene and give them clean drinking water.
- Height & Weight of every child is monitored at the centre by the teachers



Awareness Session on Nutrition :

- In this year we conducted 5 sessions on Nutrition in 3 months
- This session was conducted by Nutritionist Dr. Sukesha Satavalekar. She demonstrated healthy vegetables and how to prepare good quality low price healthy food.
- Parents were enthusiastic to learn about healthy food and habits.
- In two months (Jan & Feb 2019) total 20 sessions were conducted in which total 166 parents attended the session (18 Men & 148 Women).
- The parents enthusiastically participated in all the sessions and had an open interaction discussing their queries and share their children's food habits.

Social Development:

On-going Activities:

1. Children's Committee

- ✚ Children committee was formed to encourage participation, develop confidence and increase awareness among them about rights of children.
- ✚ The 1st committee "**Study Committee**" was formed in all centres which started on "**Development Right**".
- ✚ The other 5 committees are **Health, sports, Cleanliness, discipline and Guardian.**
- ✚ The members of the committees were shuffled every month and a democratic process was followed to elect the members by the children in the Bal Sabha.
- ✚ As these children are from migrant families the committee members keeps changing.

2. Balsabha

- All the committee meetings were held in the Bal Sabha which was conducted once in a week. In the month 4 balsabha were conducted.
- The first meeting was introduction of Balsabha, its core idea, importance and election of children for various committees. This balsabha helped the children to identify leadership quality and their understanding of child rights.
- It was followed by discussion on various issues such as problem in school/site, cleanliness problems, addiction of parents, domestic violence, gender discrimination, Participation in various activity, environmental approach, eco- friendly approach, live to life, expression of love, gender equality etc.
- The child was informed about Development of children's rights, child abuse cases and Child labour.

3. Value Education

- Value education session was conducted every month during which there was discussion & interaction on the following topics:
 - To be good & honest human being.
 - Respect towards parents, elders, siblings, neighbours, relatives etc. Also showed a movie.
 - Importance of family, care for family and not to fight or use abusive language.
 - Awareness about environment, protecting our natural resources.

4. Parents Meeting

- Monthly PTM were conducted to have an open interaction and discussion between parents and teacher about their children. The topics taken up in the PTMs were
 - Importance of School/ School admission
 - Reproductive Health (male and Female) I and II.
 - Nutritious food.
 - Personal Hygiene.
 - First aid Treatment and Emergency Plan
 - Addiction and Alcoholism
 - Literacy and Importance of Education
 - Awareness about TB, HIV and water related diseases.
 - Child Rights and Special need of Children.

5. Teachers Meeting / Training



- Teacher's meeting with project coordinator is held once in 3 months during the year.
- Monthly planner for the forthcoming month.
- Details of activities taken are discussed
- Problems and challenges are also discussed
- Training session on E-Learning was conducted
- Training on How to engage children in the centre through Art and Craft activity.

6. Nutrition:

- Nutrition supplement for the children was started in April. In some centre like nyati, Mantra and Ideal were started in July 2018. So during the year we gave snack(Rajgira Ladoo, Bhel, Banana, Biscuits, eggs etc.) menu card is made for monthly basis so that we followed during the year.

1. Summer camp

✚ During the summer apart from regular academics 15 days summer camp was organized in 5 centres with various activities.

- “Bhatukali” was celebrated to spread the message of equality when all the children contribute food grain, which was cooked at the centre and everyone ate together.
- Write a letter to Mother, art and craft activity, for good material from ice-cream sticks and matches box sticks, demo of Fruits, salad making for children, visited to nearby garden. **238 children participated in summer camp.**



2. May Day/Maharashtra Day:

✚ May Day /Labour Day was observed.

✚ The children were informed about the significance of this day.

3. Environment Day

✚ Environment day was observed by taking out a rally in the construction site& labour camp.

✚ Charts and slogans were made to create awareness about environment

✚ Tree plantation movement was also initiated.

4. Sadhbhavna Diwas

Sadbhavna Diwas was observed on 2nd of every month. 5 Solidarity days were celebrated during the year.

Visit to Police Station:

The children visited Lonikand, kondhwa and viman nagar police station. They interacted with Police officers. The Officers shared their experiences

Visit to Parvati Water Purification Dept - 2nd October' 2018

The children visited Parvati water Purification Department. Detail information was given to the children, about supply of water, They explain Water bodies of Purification site like water, air and soil mixture purification process.

Visit to Waste Water treatment plant -2nd November '2018

The children visited waste water treatment plant. They were explained about the importance waste water treatment. There was a Demonstration on waste water treatment.

Visit to Garbage Collection Centre - 17th December 2018

The children visited Garbage collection centre. They were explained about garbage collection process. Explained ghanta gadi routes for garbage collection.

Visit to MSRTC Dept -25th January 2019

The children visited MSRTC Department. Children Observed Road Transport System and Process. What is the internal structure of MSRTC? Road Mapping system? Driver and Conductor Identification Tact's, Tickets Information, they give free Bus Drive to the Children.



5. Eco Friendly Ganapati Festival

- ✚ This activity was art and Craft Activity for the children
- ✚ In this activity children made Ganesh from Clay, Leafs and Soil
- ✚ Paper craft and best out of waste was a part of this activity.
- ✚ Children gave a message to Save Girl child.



6. Human Trafficking Day :

- ✚ 30th July 2018 was observed as Anti human trafficking day.
- ✚ On that day movie on girl trafficking was shown to the children.
- ✚ After movie there was a discussion with children and parents about the reason of Human Trafficking.

7. Diwali Celebration



- ✚ 4th to 11th October Diwali was celebrated in all the centres.
- ✚ Children participated in Fort Building and Panti painting activity.
- ✚ Children participated in Lamp light making and art and craft activity.
- ✚ Special snack was arranged for children in Diwali.

8. Senior Citizen Day:

- ✚ 8 October 2018 Senior citizen day was observed.
- ✚ Children were informed about it and the significance of this day.

9. Girl Child Day:

- ✚ 11th October Girl Child Day was celebrated in all centres.
- ✚ Girls Rights, Security, Education and Health all topics were discussed with the Children. Children also discussed about their rights

10. Hand Wash Day



- ✚ Hand wash day was celebrated across the world on 12th October.
- ✚ Children and parents were taught the method of hand wash method for clean and healthy health.
- ✚ Children performed a skit on washing hands.
- ✚ **94 Parents was participated in this activity.**

11. Children's Day

- ✚ Children's Day was observed on 14th Nov 2018
- ✚ Art and craft activity done on this day for children. Tattoos, mask and art craft activity etc.
- ✚ Snacks were also served.
- ✚ **163 children participated from 5 centre.**



12. World Toilet Day:

- ✚ 19th Nov is Celebrated as World Toilet Day.
- ✚ In the Centre Children made Demo Toilets as Information. How to use?



13. Child Rights Day



- ✚ Child rights Day is observed on 20th November every year.
- ✚ On this day Children participated in a Rally to support United Nation convention on Child Rights which is ratified by all countries including India. Children handed over Child Protection policy to PMC (Pune Municipal corporation)commissioner.
- ✚ The day was celebrated at all the centres when the parents were informed about the child rights.
- ✚ **In this Rally children above 14 years participated.**

14. Annual Sports Day

- ✚ The Annual sports day was held on 29th December'2018 at Mathurawala Ground Wanwadi. Children between 6 to 18 years of age participated
- ✚ It was an inter centre competition.
- ✚ **Approximately 88 Children was Participated in Annual event.**
- ✚ Snacks and Special Lunch were also served.
- ✚ Various sports and games were conducted along with lezim display and Karate Demonstration

15. Annual Gathering



- ✚ Annual Day was celebrated on 8th Feb 2019 with theme Colors of India. In this children performed cultural and traditional Dance.
- ✚ 15 children participated in the event.
- ✚ Children performed with enthusiasm and the event was to develop confidence of children and give a platform to showcase their talent

16 Self Defense Workshop

- ✚ Tata Capital had organized a self defense workshop on 8th march 2019 .
- ✚ The children were taught the various techniques of self defense and how can they save themselves from any difficult situation.



- ✚ Women's day was also celebrated on 8th to 10th March in all centres
- ✚ This year the theme was balance for better.
- ✚ In this activity parents is learn their signature. It means they want equal opportunity to Balance for better.
- ✚ **Total 43 women participated in activity.**

Positive Impact:

- ✚ Effective Communication and rapport is there between teacher, parents and children
- ✚ Parents leave their children at the centre with trust.
- ✚ The mothers are now aware and responsible about the importance of nutritious diet and child care.
- ✚ Awareness on basic health and hygiene has improved as the children come to the centre neatly dressed and also maintain regular hygiene such as (taking bath every day, combing hair properly, cutting nails etc.)
- ✚ The parents have started understanding the importance of education, health.
- ✚ In some centre parents have started paying fee of Rs. 400/- for school transportation.
- ✚ Many children who were admitted in the formal school are going regularly and are performing well. Children also like child friendly environment in formal school and in the center.
- ✚ Due to formation of various committees the children have become more responsible and have developed confidence and positive change in behaviour is seen.

Challenges:

- ✚ In-spite of continuous effort& counselling by the teachers and coordinator some parents are still reluctant to send their children to the centre and are irresponsible.
- ✚ They only send their children to engage during their work time.
- ✚ Some parents due to their busy schedule do not attend PTMs. The teacher has to convince and request the parents to come for PTM.
- ✚ Parents keep migrating from one place/site to other; this breaks the continuity of educational and other facilities.

- ✚ Non-cooperation from the builder, who many a times are hesitant to provide basic amenities like water, electricity and comfortable space.
- ✚ Some of the parents are not responsible. Many time children suffer from weakness and mal nutrition. They delay in taking their children to the doctor for Cough and cold

Case Story - 1

Group Case study- awareness about child rights and good values not sympathy it is “empathy”

Enrolled at New Vision Centre on: May 2018

Centre Name: Marvel Sangria, Undri

- ✚ This group is formed in May 2018.
- ✚ The children are from different background.
- ✚ Sushila reddy, Ganesh Reddy, Salim, Irfan, Saniya are between 9 to 14 years.
- ✚ They regularly attend balsabha and value education session in the center.
- ✚ In January these children noticed a 9 year child Ravi coming every evening at around to sell vegetables and goes back after all his veggies. Being aware about child rights and Anti Child Labour the children tried taking information from Ravi. During their friendly interaction with Ravi, he one day shared that if he doesn't come to sell vegetables he is beaten by his grandmother and he showed a burnt wound on his chest. The children felt very sorry about Ravi and shared this with their teacher Firdaus madam and while narrating his case the children were in tears.
- ✚ The teacher appreciated them and encouraged them to raise their voice against it.
- ✚ The child stopped coming for work as they spoke to the child and they want him to study.



Development Observed:

- ✚ The children are aware about Child Rights and also showed empathy towards the child. This is due to the value education session these children attend.

Case Story 2

Group Case study - Our children and formal school children classes and situation.

Centre Name: Marvel sangria, undri.

- ✚ This group is formed in Jan 2019.
- ✚ Our 16 children admitted in mohammad wadi PMC School.
- ✚ Parents were not agreeing to take admission in school and the parents does not want to pay for transportation. After counselling parents agree to pay transportation of Rs. 300 and willing to send the children to school.
- ✚ We got Children admitted in school from 1st to 7th standard.
- ✚ Children were happy initially going to school. After a week children looked disturbed. Teacher observed and asked to children but they didn't reply. After two days Salim told the teacher about an incident in school.
- ✚ Salim shared with his teacher that local children were ragging them.
- ✚ Between this situation Salim and other children thought if they share this with their parents they will stop their education. Due to which they cannot share with their parents.
- ✚ The children shared with their teachers and also the principle was involved in it.
- ✚ Action was taken against them for which the children were very happy..



Development Observed:

- ✚ Salim developed as a team leader value.
- ✚ Children spoke and solved their problems.
- ✚ They are not free with their parents but are with the center teacher
- ✚ Problem solving methods they refer.

Case Story 3

Name- Avinash manoj Rathod 11years/M

Enrolled at New Vision Centre on: 22/08/2016

Centre Name: Nyati Elan, Wagholi, Pune

- ✚ Originally they are from Village-gaulh, tehsil- Pusad, Dist- Yavatmal.
- ✚ When he came to Wagholi, Pune at Nyati Elan site he was



a child labour.

- ✚ He was not going to school.
- ✚ He joined our center in 2016. It took 3 years for him to adjust with the surrounding.
- ✚ He is very good and very clever boy. He is very breve.
- ✚ When he came at our centre we don't know he is going to collect waste and is a waste picker
- ✚ In June 2016 we admitted him in school but he went only for one day. He stopped going to school in between as children used to bully him.
- ✚ The teacher constantly counselled and went to his house also
- ✚ This year during a balsabha session for children between 6 to 18 years age teacher saw a marked change and he regularly attends the session. He is not going to pick waste now or to sell.
- ✚ He comes regularly to the centre and attends the whole day programme. Now he is very active and is good in handmade paper craft, and dance

Development Observed:

- ✚ Avinash has changed in these 3 years.
- ✚ He is aware what he is doing or not.
- ✚ He comes regularly in the centre.

Case Story 4

Name: Saniya Raju shekh 13 years/F

Enrolled at New Vision Centre on: 15/1/2018

Centre Name: Marvel Sangria, Undri.

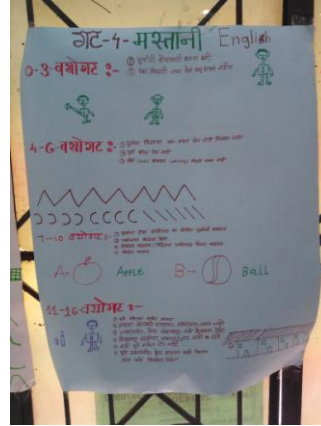
- ✚ She came to our centre in January 2018.
- ✚ They are from Solapur District.
- ✚ She studied till 4th std in the village school.
- ✚ She has 2 sisters, 1 younger brother.
- ✚ She is the eldest sister and very clever girl.
- ✚ She was brought here to take care of her brother and sister. Her mother was not ready to send her to school. She always fights with her mother as she wants to go to school. Her mother hits her also.
- ✚ As she wanted to go to formal school we took admission but her mother did not allow her to go to school and used to beat her if she talks about going to school.
- ✚ As Saniya used to attent Bal sabha and was became aware about child rights.
- ✚ One day when she was arguing with her mother to go school and when her mother denied she spoke about her rights. .



Development Observed:

- ✚ Saniya is aware about her rights and child right.
- ✚ She is a brave girl and fighting for her rights
- ✚ She participates and regularly attends all session and try to use in her daily life..
